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### **COVID** Safe Measurements - Close Contacts

These Guidelines apply to household contacts (someone who lives with a person who has tested positive for COVID-19) and close contacts (someone who has been formally notified by NSW Health that they are a close contact). If you are not a household or close contact, but have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, please refer to the Information for people exposed to COVID-19 factsheet (https://www.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/management/people-exposed-to-covid).

· If you do not have any symptoms (<u>https://www.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/stay-safe/testing/</u>

<u>symptoms#toc-symptoms-of-covid-19</u>), you do not need to self-isolate, but you should be aware that you are at increased risk of COVID-19 and need to take steps to protect people around you. You must follow these Guidelines for 7 days from the last time someone in your household tested positive for COVID-19, or as otherwise directed by NSW Health if you are a close contact.

 $\cdot$  Where practicable, you should keep your child at home to help reduce the spread of COVID-19.

• Before your child returns to school, it is strongly recommended that they have a COVID-19 test. NSW Health and the Department of Education would like to remind all parents/carers and the school community that now is the best time to protect your children against viral illnesses such as the flu and COVID-19 by staying home if unwell and getting vaccinated. They urge all parents and carers to keep children at home if they are unwell.

Remember to use a rapid antigen test if your child is experiencing even mild COVID-19 symptoms (<u>https://www.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/stay-safe/testing/symptoms</u>) and keep them home until they are well and free of any symptoms, even if their result is negative.

**Please note** RAT tests were sent home last week. If you need additional tests, please contact the office.

If your child's RAT result is positive, it must be reported through the Service NSW website or Service NSW app (<u>https://www.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/stay-safe/testing/register-positive-rat-test-result</u>). Please also inform us at the school if your child tests positive for COVID-19. For information on managing COVID-19 and isolating at home refer to the NSW Government's testing positive to COVID-19 fact sheet (<u>https://www.nsw.gov.au/covid-19/management/advice-for-confirmed</u>).

**<u>Payments</u>** - When sending in money with your child, please ensure it is enclosed i.e. in an envelope for it to be placed into the notes box without it getting lost or mixed up with other payments.

<u>**ClassDojo</u>** - Are you connected to our ClassDojo app? Facebook and ClassDojo our main methods of communication between the school and our community. Please continue to monitor the ClassDojo app and Facebook for important messages and updates.</u>

**Absences** - If your child is absent, it is important to let the school know. To notify the school of your child's absence, please either phone/email the school or reply to the SMS.

**Educational Resource Fee** - K-6 Educational resource fee is for specific books and learning tools for students to complete their class work. Each student is provided with the equipment needed to participate in curriculum learning. It would be appreciated if this fee could be paid in full at the Office. If you do not think this is possible please contact the school on 4945 4433.

# **Parent**|Teacher Interviews






## Attendance

Education for your child is important and regular attendance at school is essential for your child to achieve their educational best and increase their career and life options. NSW public schools work in partnership with parents/carers to encourage and support regular attendance of children and young people. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children.

### What are my legal responsibilities?

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and below the minimum school leaving age. The Education Act 1990 requires that parents/carers ensure their children of compulsory school age are enrolled at, and regularly attend school, or, are registered with NESA, Teaching and Educational Standards for home schooling. Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

### Screen time and physical play

#### Movement and play are important for kids development



Choose small screen games and Apps that reduce kids sitting time and encourage physical activity.

- Choose videos, games or Apps that get your kids moving e.g. dancing, sports, yoga. Join in using the App or game with your kids
- Plan a walk using a digital map. Take photos of interesting things along the way
- Video your kids learning a new skill e.g. hopping, a new skateboard trick. Replay the video to track their progress over time
- Be a role model! Show your kids how to track their physical activity. Talk about how being active is fun & feels great! Show them how far you walked or swam last week!
